<p>Can you retell the story? You could head over to Purple Mash 2animte and create your own animation to retell the story.</p> 	<p>Film a book review of your favourite story. Show us the front cover, talk through the plot (but don't give any spoilers away), let us know about your favourite characters and finally, who would you recommend it to?</p> 	<p>Create a book in a box. Choose your favourite scene from the story, and create a 3D version of it inside a box.</p> 	<p>Using the recipe card, can you have a go at making some bear-shaped cookies?</p> 
<p>Choose a research focus: The bear leaves the forest and heads to the city. What are the differences and similarities between these 2 locations? The bear plays his first concert on Broadway. What can you find out about Broadway? Who invented the piano?</p> 	<p>Using blankets and duvets, can you build your own reading den and snuggle up with a good book? Take a picture of your reading den and send it your class teacher.</p> 	<p>Make a puppet. Can you create your own puppets based on the characters from the story?</p> 	<p>Can you have a go at baking a cake and decorating it by recreating the front cover of The Bear and the Piano?</p> 
<p>Inference: How does the bear feel at different points of the story? Can you find evidence to support your ideas?</p> 	<p>On YouTube can you put on a crackling fire? Snuggle up with a hot chocolate and share a book/books with someone for 20 minutes.</p> 	<p>Book potato characters. Can you recreate one of the characters from the story by making a potato character?</p> 	<p>What if the bear could play a different instrument? Could you have a go at creating your own instrument? Maybe you could make a shaker? A drum or a guitar?</p> 
<p>Do you think the Bear should have left the forest? Can you come up with a list of reasons for and against leaving the forest.</p> 	<p>Head over to word-it-out and create your own wordal, by filling it with reasons why reading is important to you. Take a picture/ send your creations to your class teacher. https://worditout.com/word-cloud/create</p> 	<p>Create your own version of the book by putting your own spin on it. You could type up or hand write your book and add illustrations.</p> 	<p>Can you design and make a delicious healthy snack/ treat that could be served during the interval of the Bear's performances?</p>
